Scripture

1 Corinthians 4: 1-5

Brothers and sisters:

Thus should one regard us: as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God.

Now it is of course required of stewards

that they be found trustworthy.

It does not concern me in the least

that I be judged by you or any human tribunal;

I do not even pass judgment on myself;

I am not conscious of anything against me,

but I do not thereby stand acquitted;

the one who judges me is the Lord.

Therefore, do not make any judgment before the appointed time, until the Lord comes,

for he will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will manifest the motives of our hearts, and then everyone will receive praise from God.

Our Scripture Reflection

There are two definitions of the Greek word for "judgment":

- 1. To condemn
- 2. To identify error or sinful behavior

There were those in Corinth who in their arrogance had condemned Paul. Paul makes it very clear to them and all that while he may not be flawless, he is faithful. Paul gives everything he has for the sake of the Gospel and his intentions are pure. To those who try to condemn him, Paul reminds them that there is only one Judge, Jesus Christ. Jesus has the final word on Paul and Paul puts all of his trust in Him.
